Q: How did this ministry, Salt & Light, begin? A: Habitat for Humanity

A few years later, Melvin Flores, the Director of Habitat in Honduras, left Habitat and formed Ministerio Sal y Luz. We continued going to Honduras with expanded mission opportunities with this new ministry.

Fast forward 15 years. When Susan and I were in Honduras a few years ago, we were having a conversation with Daniel Tercero about how the ministry grew out of trips teams were taking to work for Habitat. Daniel
